Reconciliation Australia welcomes 2Construct to the Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) program with the formal endorsement of its inaugural Reflect RAP.

2Construct joins a network of more than 3,000 corporate, government, and not-for-profit organisations that have made a formal commitment to reconciliation through the RAP program.

Since 2006, RAPs have provided a framework for organisations to leverage their structures and diverse spheres of influence to support the national reconciliation movement. The program's potential for impact is greater than ever, with close to 3 million people now working or studying in an organisation with a RAP.

These outcomes contribute towards the five dimensions of reconciliation: race relations; equality and equity; institutional integrity; unity; and historical acceptance.

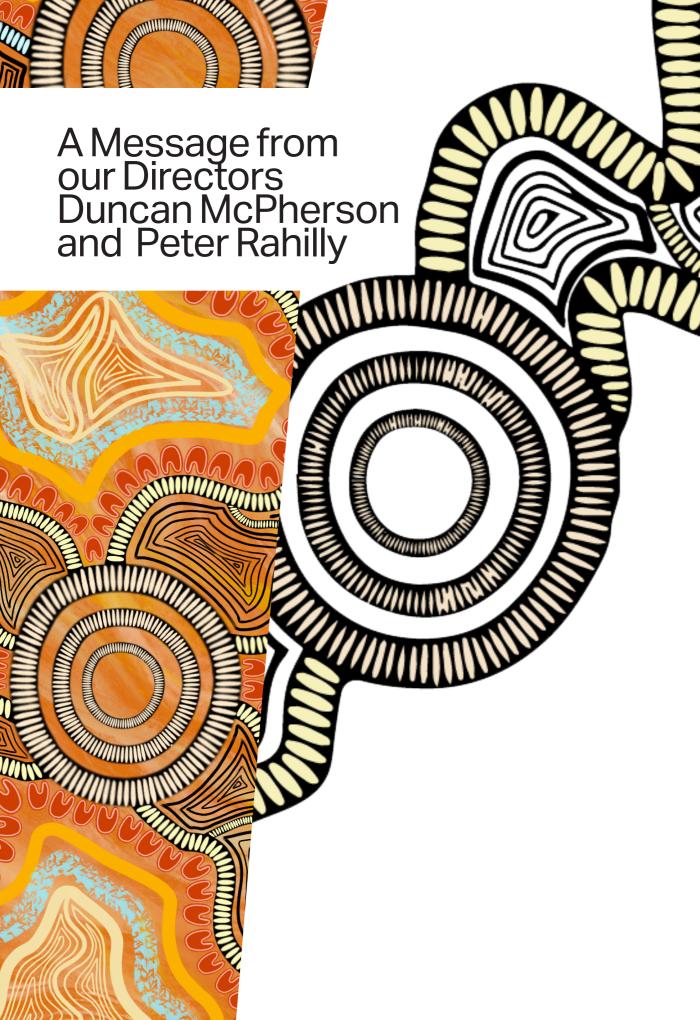

Benefits beyond Reconciliation:

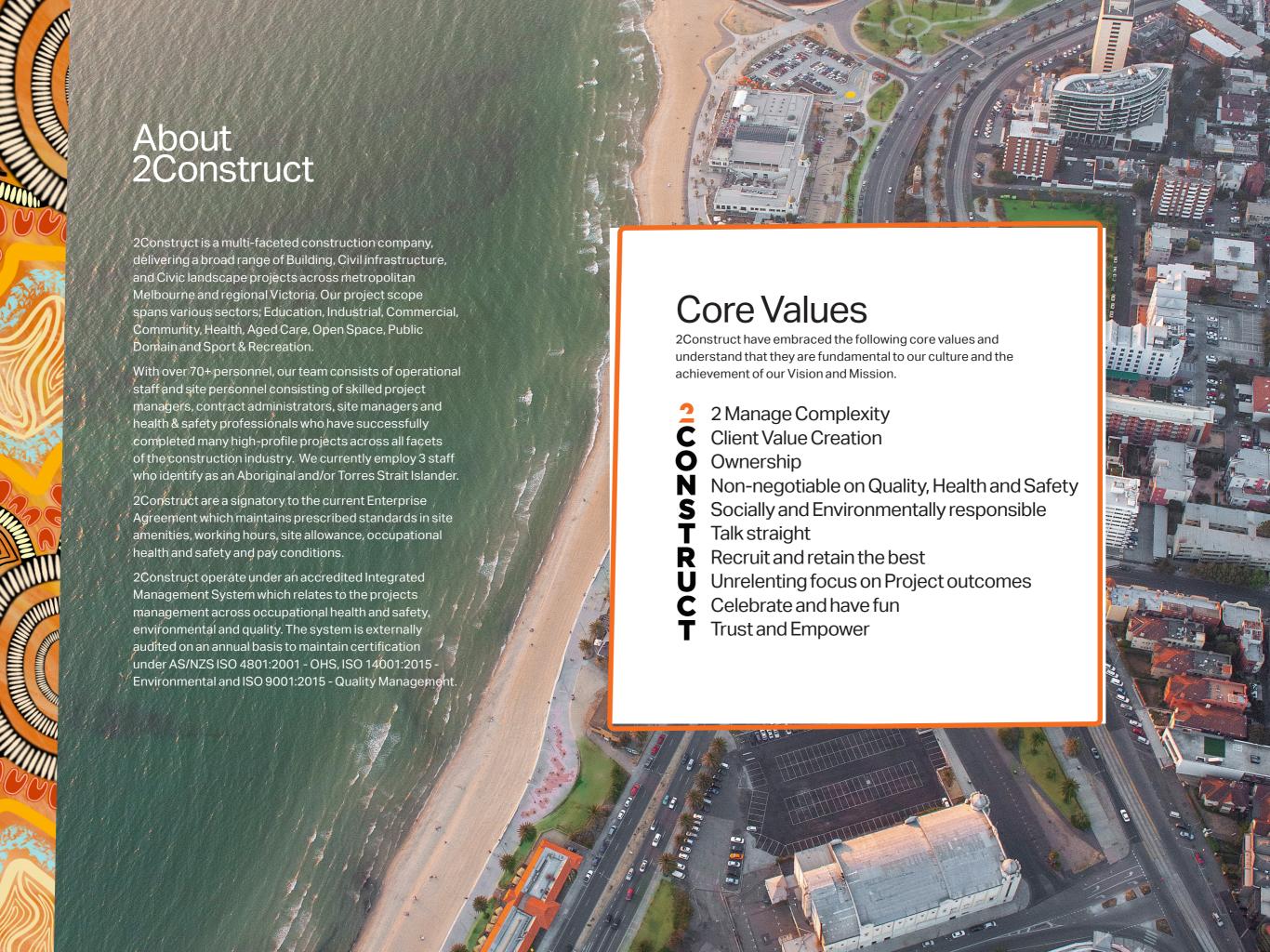
- Business growth: A RAP strategy enhances compliance, supplier diversity, and customer satisfaction, meeting evolving procurement preferences.

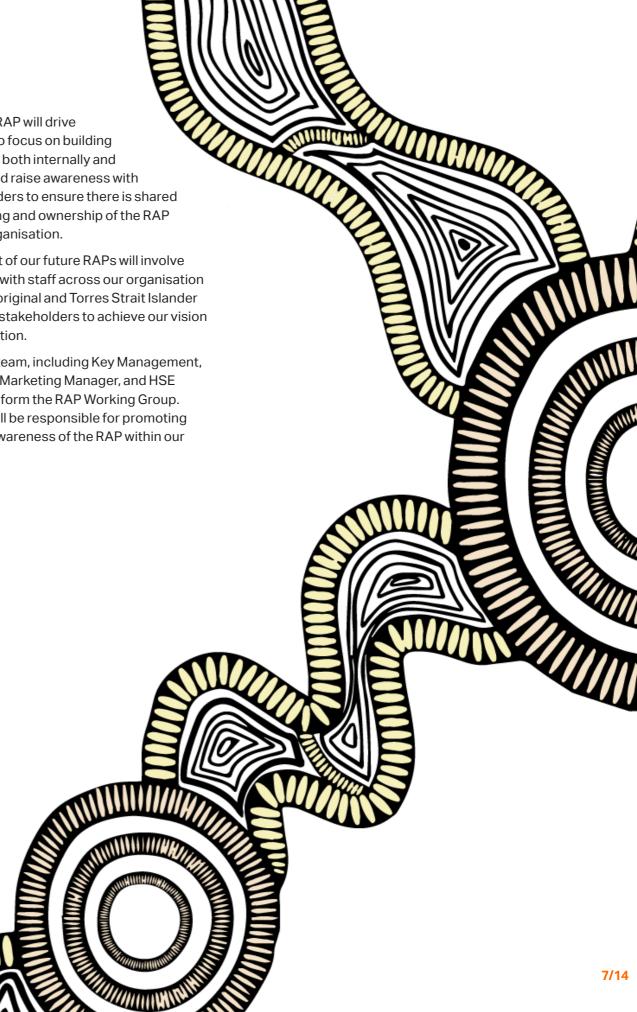
Our RAP represents an agreed strategy of how 2Construct will implement and measure practical actions. The RAP will create and build upon meaningful relationships that enhance the respect and promotion of sustainable opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.

In developing this Reflect RAP, 2Construct is committed to completing the set actions outlined in our RAP implementation deliverables, and over the next 12/18 months we will ensure the positioning of the business to implement an effective and mutually beneficial program to form part of our future Reconciliation Action Plans.

This Reflect RAP will drive 2Construct to focus on building relationships both internally and externally, and raise awareness with our stakeholders to ensure there is shared understanding and ownership of the RAP within our organisation.

A dedicated team, including Key Management, HR Manager, Marketing Manager, and HSE Manager, will form the RAP Working Group. This group will be responsible for promoting and raising awareness of the RAP within our organisation.

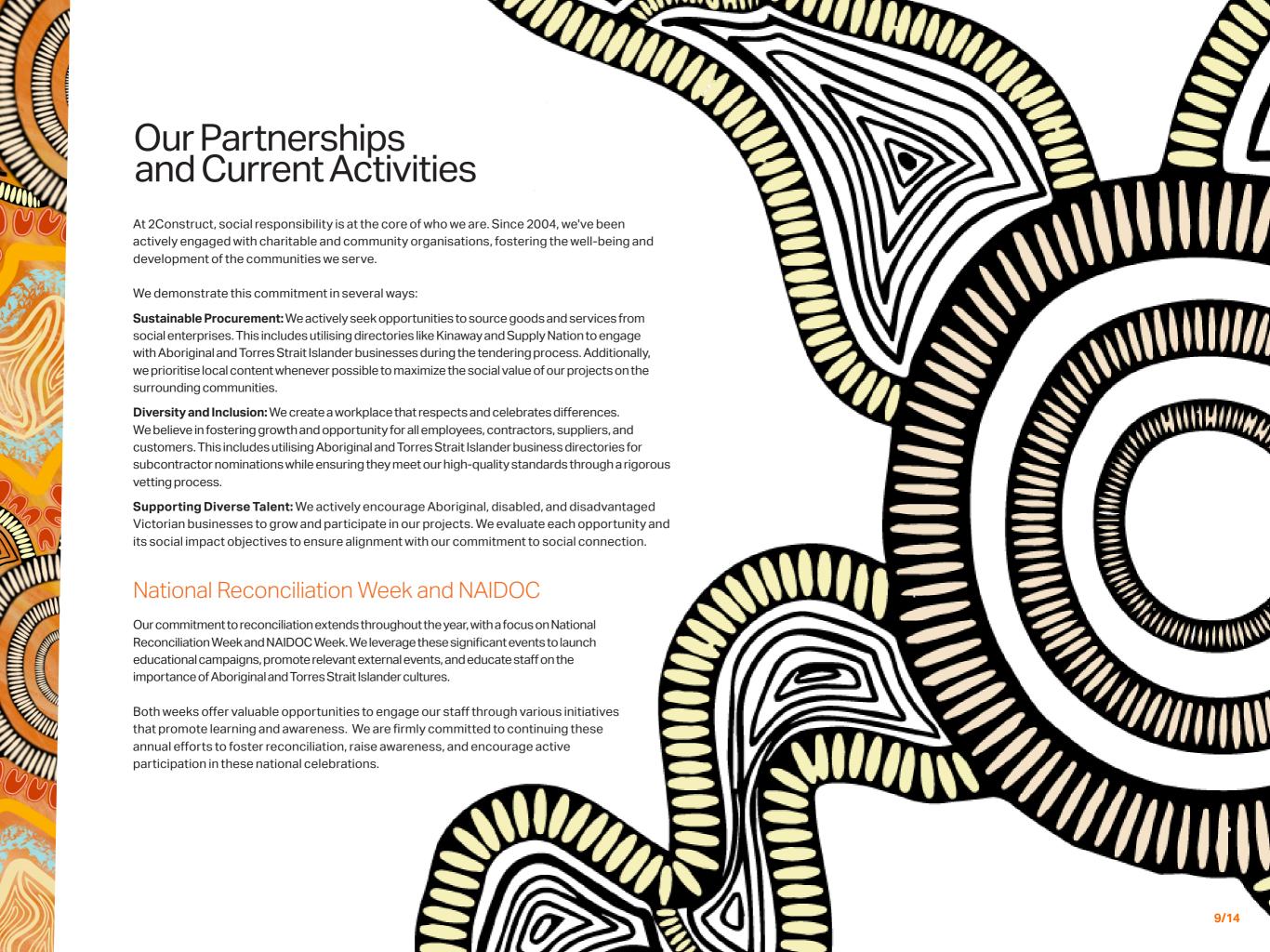
Elements of the Artwork

Circles of Country: The circles depicted throughout the artwork symbolise the various areas of Melbourne, highlighting the locations where 2Construct's projects are underway. Each circle is filled with rich, detailed linework representing the materials, time, and labor invested into building vital community, educational, and sports facilities. These facilities are not just structures but pivotal spaces for social interaction, cultural exchange, and health enhancement, fostering a sense of belonging among diverse groups.

Pathways of Connection: The black lines interconnecting the circles illustrate the roads and pathways between these project sites. These paths signify the journey of resources and people, crucial to the successful completion of each project. The meticulous detail within these pathways reflects the careful planning and logistics involved in moving materials and resources, ensuring that each project adheres to best practices in quality, time, and costeffectiveness.

People Element: The red symbols bordering the pathways represent the human aspect of 2Construct's operations. Each symbol stands for the company's employees, whose collective efforts and dedication are integral to realising the vision of a better-built environment. This element underscores the idea that every individual within the company contributes to the overarching goal of sustainable and inclusive growth.

Landscape and Sustainability: The various textures and colors within the artwork, including yellow lines, blue textures, and cream networks, symbolise both the diverse landforms of Melbourne and the materials used in 2Construct's projects. These elements are a nod to the company's commitment to sustainability, emphasising that their efforts extend beyond environmental benefits to encompass economic development and social enrichment.
